Dear Parents / Guardians

Governors last wrote to you on 22 June thanking you for your questions and comments regarding our exploration of joining the Excalibur Academies Trust and promising an update. The update is that we have not moved forward.

A particular thank you again to all parents who demonstrated interest in our questions around academies or came to the academies meetings. You showed such commitment to St Nicholas being the best school it can be for our children and asked a lot of good questions. Your desire for your children to continue to have access to St John's as your preferred secondary school was noted as was your concern that the ethos and nature of our school is protected.

We mentioned at the parents meetings that there is an issue about the number of Foundation (church sponsored) Governors represented on the Excalibur Trust. In order to protect the nature of its Voluntary Aided schools the Diocese is insisting at least 50% of the Academy board are Foundation Governors. Excalibur has increased its proposed Foundation Governors to 38 but will not increase it further since it is a mixed academy. Since our parent and governor meetings there have been conversations between Excalibur and the Diocese. During the summer I hope to meet with the Diocese to put our case to them as well.

A Governor attended an Excalibur Trust conference and worked with one of the academy schools to experience how they do their planning. She reported that it was a very positive experience.

Moving onto other matters:-


