MATHEMATICS - Throughout the term the children will play maths games to improve their number skills

Ongoing Number skills Year 1 + and - up to 20 Missing numbers number sentences. Year 2 Arithmetic skills + - number sentences 2 digit to ones two digits and tens, two digits and two digits. Missing number sentences. Inverse relationship between adding and subtracting.

<u>Place Value/Number</u> Y1 - Reading and writing numbers in numerals to 100 and in words to 20. Y2 Counting in steps of 2 3 5 from any number Recognising sequences and patterns. Revising greater and lesser than signs.

<u>Geometry 2D and 3D shape</u> Y1 - recognise and naming **Position**, **direction and movement** including whole, half, quarter, and three quarter turns **Y2** - properties and using correct language including the number of sides and lines of symmetry 3D shapes including the number of edges vertices and faces, Identifying 2D shapes on 3D shapes.

ENGLISH Alongside and within the Fiction and non-fiction work Y1/2 will be focussing on:

Spelling Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG)

Year 1- Continuation of adding endings to words and identifying past and present tenses. Continuing to punctuate sentences using a capital letter and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.

Year 2- Exploring word endings. Suffixes in texts to spell longer words, e.g. -ment, -ness, -ful, -less, -ly Present and past tense. Building on all of the work from previous terms including writing sentences with different forms e.g. statement, question, command, exclamation. Subordination (using when, if, that, or because) and co-ordination (using or, and, or but) Expanded noun phrases to describe and specify, e.g. the blue butterfly. Using apostrophes for contracted forms.

Phonics will continue to be taught throughout the week. This takes the form of a phonics session taught in groups

Year 1 - Phase 5 (Letters and Sounds) revision of vowel phonemes, spilt diagraphs and tricky words

Year 2 - alternative spelling choices of vowel and consonant phonemes as well as high frequency words

<u>Handwriting</u> Continuation of cursive handwriting with the formation of lower case and upper case letters and applying this to writing simple words. **Reading** Exploring reading and retelling a wide variety of traditional tales from other cultures and non-fiction texts linked to our topic.

All children will be and taught reading strategies and how to apply them together with reading comprehension skills within small groups in reading guided reading sessions. Year 2 will also be continuing to learn how to find answers to written questions in a text through weekly reading comprehension tasks. All children will bring home reading books to read with an adult from our home reading scheme.
