Once again, a group of our mathematicians were invited to Pinewood Preparatory school for a maths challenge afternoon. The children enjoyed a range of activities using problem solving skills, logic and reasoning. They all really enjoyed the maths as well as meeting children from a number of other schools.

## **2018 Attainment Success**

As usual, our end of Key Stage 2 SATS (Standard Attainment Tests) were tackled in May by our very talented Year 6. We are proud to report that the school is above national and Wiltshire averages across all subjects with our reading results 'significantly above', once again.

In Key Stage 1, our teacher assessed results are also above national and Wiltshire averages.

Year 1 pupils also participated in the National phonics screening with 87% of pupils being successful.

In Foundation, we received a moderation visit in June during which a representative from the County Council visited our school to check our assessments are correct and in line with national standards. This year, we have 85% reaching a good level of development. Well done to all those pupils involved!

Congratulations to all the children involved for all the effort that they put into these assessments and to the teachers for preparing them so well.
