Areas of Exploration



Science

Lots of exciting things to look at when focussing on animals! With a slant on African animals in particular, Goldfinches are going to look at the guestion: What are the basic needs of animals, including humans for survival?

History

This term in history we will be exploring two distinct areas of learning, including investigating the lives of a significant individual (How did Wangari Muta Maathai impact the lives of others?) and also exploring food with the key guestion how has food changed over time?



Geography

Through lessons we are going to focus on several African countries including Kenya, looking at the physical geography, and comparing similarities and differences within out local area.



English

Writing

In writing we will have lots of opportunities to create plots, exciting characters and settings in narrative work, which will include using text s as inspiration. We will also be finding ample opportunities to practice our non fiction writing within English and other subjects.

Reading

In reading each year group will continue with a sound/spelling focus each week, and these will be shared with you plus some spellings to learn at home each week!



DT

During the next two terms we will be looking at three distinct areas of learning including Food (where we will be designing a nutritious wrap), textiles work to create a wallet/purse and finally mechanisms where we design a moving animal.

Art

During the next two term lots of work in art will be focusing on drawing and painting using various media. We will also explore the work of African artist Edward Saidi Tingatinga and look at painting in the style of his work.



Religious Education

During Term Five the focus will be on Christianity and looking at the concept of Gospel by investigating the guestion 'what is the good news that Jesus brings?'. In Term Six our focus will be on Judaism and looking the the key question 'How special is the relationship Jews have with God?'

Maths

Both year groups are following their own work but will look at position and direction, time, and problem solving. Year 1 will investigate weight and volume, while Year 2 will investigate mass, capacity and temperature.

Computing

We will start by looking at digital writing in Term Five. which will include learning how to format text. In Term Six out focus will be on designing algorithms (instructions) to make an interactive quiz!

PSHE

In Term Five we will be looking at the theme of growing up, followed by how to stay safe in a variety of situations in Term Six.

With Mr Smith Goldfinches will be looking at athletics and striking team games.

Music

Music this term will consist of instrumental lessons (recorder) and then looking at African all and response singing.

French

French lessons will be looking at basic phrases related to the weather this
