While the Victorian building is still in use as a classroom, over the years we have enhanced and added to the building to provide room for our pupils to grow. This year, we are excited to announce the addition of a new classroom from the hall area as well as the refurbishment of our adventure playground.

Building for the future

By engaging with our local community, we provide pupils with an understanding of the world around them and how to be an active, thoughtful citizen.

Trips within our local community, such as watching lambing at a local farm, teach pupils about their environment.

Supporting our community, with events such as the Harvest supper for elderly residents, helps pupils to become respectful of others.

In our community, FOBS (Friends of Baydon School) raise money to support pupils' learning experiences.

Learning outside the classroom is as important as learning within and so we provide a range of exciting experiences. These include residentials (in KS2) to Braeside and Rockley, trips to support the curriculum across all year groups, whole school creative days, Bikeability classes, tournaments (in-house and against other local schools), various after school clubs and the option of attending our breakfast and after school club provision, Wagtails.
